#### A word from our Board Chairman.....

My name is Jonathan Sharp and I am the current board chair for Meals on Wheels Plus, Inc. in Abilene. I have been serving in that capacity since May of this year, and have been on the board of directors since 2017. I was (and continue to be) a sponsor for the golf tournament each year, and my service on the board has meant that I not only attend and contribute to the board meetings, but like other members of the board, also do behind-thescenes work on various committees, such as taking care of the building and grounds, strategic planning, budgeting, and endowment review. It is on the committees that the bulk of work for the organization is done; the committee members do the hard

work of gathering and organizing information so that they can bring their recommendations to the Executive Committee and then the full board. I can tell you that I am privileged to serve with many talented and generous people both on and off the board who are affiliated with this organization. I learn a lot from the people around me, and am appreciative of their time and talent.

We deliver to every strata of society at Meals on Wheels, and I believe strongly that this is what we are called to do. Some can pay for their meals, and many cannot. It is our policy to feed people first, and then look for the money to pay for that meal later. Meals on Wheels in Abilene delivers more than 1300 meals per day, and that number has gone up every year, and we expect that trend to continue. This is where many of you come in, as we rely on donations from the community to make up for what is not paid for, either by the client or by government programs, like block grants and grants from the Texas Department of Agriculture. I can also tell you that Meals on Wheels is very careful with your donations, stretching every dollar in this economic environment to be good stewards of what you entrust to this organization. Meals on Wheels is funded largely by private donations from the local community, and that donation need is always rising along with the number of meals that are served each day.


I have been delivering meals for Meals on Wheels for much longer than I have been serving on the board of directors, ever since my now-college-age girls were babies and tod-dlers. At that time I had been thinking about volunteering to deliver, and had a friend that volunteered who would encourage me to join the team of volunteers; I just never got around to giving the office a call.

That is, until one day when it was snowing in Abilene and I heard on the radio that Meals on Wheels desperately needed drivers, because so many of the regular drivers could not drive in the snow that day. I had a 4-wheel drive truck, as well as years of experience in the Northeast as well as overseas driving in snowy conditions, so off I went. It felt great to be able to help the community that day using a skill-set that I already had. That was the first day that I delivered, but certainly not the last.

As I continued to deliver meals through the years, I would sometimes bring along my daughters when I delivered, and they loved helping out and getting greeted by the clients. The clients also loved their energy and seeing them. Bringing children along on the delivery route brings joy to the clients as well as to the children. I also remember when I started volunteering, Meals on Wheels was in the old building, and it was very clear at the time that the building was not large enough to meet the growing need for home-delivered meals. The new building (if we can still call it new at almost 20 years old) can handle the meals needed to serve the community, but we are always short on volunteers to meet the ever-expanding need. If that is something that you have been considering, I encourage you to act on it and start volunteering. It takes just about an hour of your day, and you can volunteer just one day per week, like I do, or as many as you like. If your schedule does not allow you to volunteer as a driver now, I would encourage you to talk to those in your circle of influence and tell them about the ongoing need for volunteers to deliver.


