I thought you would like to know.....

Over the past several months we have been worried about the future for Meals on Wheels since the initial Congressional House Budget included cuts, with the possibility of elimination, of the Social Services Block Grant (SSBG). This was not the first time Congress considered eliminating this funding source that makes up about half of the Meals on Wheels budget. However, the budget that went to the President for his signature did not include eliminating SSBG. We are most grateful for that.

However, that doesn't mean that the SSBG funding is safe. On July 14 the Department of Health & Human Services finalized it's mass terminations. Some 20,000

people received notice that they were terminated as of the close of business that day. The massive layoffs and elimination of whole departments may include staff that are involved in administering the SSBG. In addition, Congressmen Jody Arrington has said that the new budget is just the beginning of spending reforms.

We are saddened that the new budget included deep cuts to Medicaid and Food Stamps, programs that so many of our most needy clients depend on. We are already overwhelmed with requests for meals and have tightened our eligibility requirements because we simply aren't able to feed everyone who asks for help. We expect the number of requests to increase significantly as the elderly and younger adults living with disabilities deal with the cuts to Medicaid and Food Stamps.

As Texas deals with the cuts in federal funding in so many different areas they could choose to no longer include Meals on Wheels as one of the services funded by the SSBG in Texas. That would negatively impact some 107 meal programs in Texas.

A special word of appreciation goes to everyone who wrote letters, sent emails and made phone calls to Congressman Jodey Arrington, our Senators and others in Congress. You made the difference. Over the next year or so we may be calling on you for your help once again.

Since Title XX funding appears to be safe for now, we are in a much better position to help the most needy who need our services. Because SSBG only covers about half of our budget there remains a great need for contributions from the communities we serve. The other half of our budget is made up of donations & fund raising events. There is also a great need for volunteers to deliver meals. When we don't have volunteers, we have to pay someone to deliver meals.

Let me take a minute to report that the Meals on Wheels Plus 50th Anniversary Celebration on May 24th was a great success! Terry Bradshaw was a most entertaining speaker and one person observed that he doubted that most of us had laughed that much in years. Thank you to all the sponsors, everyone who purchased tickets and supported this special event in any way. What a wonderful way to celebrate 50 Years of driving away hunger in Abilene.

For the past 50 years I am sure there are thousands of stories about the impact Meals on Wheels has made on peoples lives. We would love to hear a couple of your stories. Everyone involved in MOW has my heart felt thanks. This truly takes a village. Or rather, in our case, 15 villages.

We often think about how we are lifting their spirit by greeting them with a meal and a smile, but I wanted to point out how I have been blessed by the great people we serve.







Betty's Journey

When the first Board of Directors met in May 1975, I was elected Treasurer. Kind of strange since we had very little money. One of our first challenges was to find someone to be a full time Executive Director. But we couldn't afford to pay a salary or set up an office. We were serving 80 individuals in Abilene and getting meals from three different locations. We bought meals at a discount from Barton's Cafeteria in the River Oaks Shopping Center and a few diabetic diets from Hendricks Hospital. We also picked up meals from the Rose Park Senior Citizen's Center.

There were no records for the people receiving meals nor the volunteers. Home visits needed to be made so we would know which meal recipients to worry about if they didn't answer the door and so we would know who to call if we found someone had fallen or had a medical emergency. We badly needed to have our own kitchen so that we would have one pick up point for the meals and control the menu. We needed donations. There needed to be a Meals on Wheels listing in the phone book so people would know how to reach the program.

There were some really great volunteers delivering meals and they were asked about being our volunteer Executive Director. They would be expected to make home visits to all the clients, seek donors, search for a kitchen, etc. Sadly, we were turned down each time. Finally, I was asked if I would do it. Who me? I had been delivering meals for the past two years and had a passion for the program. But I knew I didn't have the skills nor ability needed. What would happen if I said no? I agreed to think about it. A few weeks later I felt a calling on my life and agreed to try.

In the past 50 years we have never been in debt. But several times we have weathered a period when donations, fund-raising events and grants didn't bring in enough funds to cover expenses. Following one of those very lean times the Board of Directors developed an Endowment Fund. Donations made in memory or honor of someone, or gifts from an estate would go into that "savings account" we call the Endowment Fund. We draw a small percentage from the Endowment Fund each year to be used for operations the following year. The balance can be used at the discretion of the Board of Directors to get us through lean times.

It hasn't always been easy. There have been some really tough times, but there have been many, many times when there were blessings. The meal recipients, volunteers, donors, Board Members, staff and many others crept into my heart. I have been blessed to be allowed to play a small role in this important program that grew from 80 recipients 50 years ago to over 1,700 today. It has been a joy to be able to expand the service to include small near-by communities that never had a Meals on Wheels program, or to be there when their program closed.

Today Meals on Wheels delivers a freshly prepared lunch five days a week to frail individuals in Abilene and 14 small communities. But what is the Plus? It's a lot! Clients have an entrée choice. Trained volunteers do a wellness check for each person on their route. Sometimes they find someone who has fallen or is experiencing a medical emergency. They call 911 and the client receives the care they need. Many times, the volunteer with a meal is the only person that client will see all day. Friendships are formed and lives enriched. Some of the most food insecure, low income individuals also receive a meal for Saturday or food from the "Groceries on Wheels" program. Low income clients can receive a free bag of pet food for their furry family members and a limited number receive a free annual exam plus shots, etc. from a local vet's office. Abilene clients who enjoy reading but can't go to the library are enrolled in "Books on Wheels" and receive home delivered books from the library. Free electric fans, space heaters and microwaves are available for low income meal recipients who need them.

I have been blest to have the privilege to be a part of this program that truly enriches lives.

Phone Scams Targeting Seniors: How to Spot the Red Flags and Stay Safe

Senior citizens are often the targets of phone scams, with callers using fear, urgency, or kindness to trick victims into sending money or sharing personal information. Understanding how these scams work — and knowing what to do — can help protect you and your loved ones.

What Scammers Try to Do

Phone scammers use many different stories to gain trust or create panic. Common tactics include:

- Pretending to be a family member in trouble. A caller might say, "Grandma, I've been arrested and need money for bail," often claiming the situation is urgent and begging you not to tell anyone.
- Impersonating government agencies. Scammers may pose as representatives from the IRS, Social Security, or Medicare, claiming you owe money or that your benefits will be cut off unless you pay immediately.
- Amazon or PayPal scams. You might get a call or text saying there's a "problem with your recent purchase," "unauthorized charges on your account," or "a large order placed in your name." The scammer then asks you to confirm your account information, give remote access to your device, or send money to "fix" the issue. Legitimate companies like Amazon and PayPal never call you directly to ask for payment or personal details.
- Offering fake prizes or investments. You might be told you've "won a sweepstakes" but must pay taxes or fees before receiving your prize.
- Tech support scams. A caller may say your computer has a virus and offer to "fix" it but they really want remote access to steal passwords and financial information.
- Charity scams. Some con artists pretend to represent a nonprofit or disaster relief effort, taking advantage of your goodwill.



Red Flags to Watch For



Be cautious if the caller

- Pressures you to act quickly or keep the call a secret.
- Requests payment by gift card, wire transfer, or cryptocurrency legitimate organizations never ask for these forms of payment.
- Asks for personal or financial information, such as your Social Security number, bank account, or credit card details.
- Claims to be from a well-known company (like Amazon, PayPal, or your bank) but refuses to provide a callback number or proof of identity.
- Makes the call sound too good to be true it usually is.

What To Do If You Receive a Suspicious Call

- Hang up immediately. You don't owe the caller any explanation.
- Never share personal or financial information over the phone unless you initiated the call to a verified number.
- Don't trust caller ID. Scammers can "spoof" numbers to make it look like they're calling from a local business, government office, or even Amazon or PayPal.
- Report the call to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) at www.reportfraud.ftc.gov or your local police department.
- Contact the company directly using the phone number or website listed on your account statements not the number given by the caller.
- Involve a trusted family member or friend. Consider adding a trusted person to your bank account's release or contact Information, so the bank can speak with them if there's ever a question about suspicious activity or a call you've received. Having another set of eyes and ears can help prevent a costly mistake.
- Talk to someone you trust. If a call seems suspicious, check with a friend, family member, or caregiver before taking any
 actions.
